#### WORLD MISSION MONTH - OCTOBER 2021 Reflection by Father Alexandre Kabera for Oct. 17th

"For the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many." (Mark 10: 45). In the Gospel, we see that the attitude of the sons of Zebedee is exactly the opposite of that of their Master: they behave like boastful teenagers, who only aim to be popular in front of their companions who, obviously, are indignant.

James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came to Jesus and said to him, "Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you." He replied, "What do you wish me to do for you?" They answered him, "Grant that in your glory we may sit one at your right and the other at your left." Jesus said to them, "You do not know what you are asking. Can you drink the cup that I drink or be baptized with the baptism with which I am baptized?"

They said to him, "We can." Jesus said to them, "The cup that I drink, you will drink, and with the baptism with which I am baptized, you will be baptized; but to sit at my right or at my left is not mine to give but is for those for whom it has been prepared." When the ten heard this, they became indignant at James and John.

Jesus' response to the pretentious request of the sons of Zebedee is full of tenderness: he points out to the two disciples that they have asked for a privilege whose importance they cannot comprehend, in their ignorance. Moreover, it is not up to him to grant, yet he seems to approve their bold confidence in affirming that they can drink his cup: "*The cup that I drink you will drink; and with the baptism with which I am baptized, you will be baptized*". It is as if he were saddened for the future suffering and death of his apostles that they would endure in their human condition in testimony to the love they would bear him, the Master, even if small and imperfect.

Then Jesus, aware that the indignation of the other ten, gives everyone a wonderful lesson in humility, service and self-giving, showing who the true disciple is:

Jesus summoned them and said to them, "You know that those who are recognized as rulers over the Gentiles Lord it over them, and their great ones make their authority over them felt. But it shall not be so among you. Rather, whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant; whoever wishes to be first among you will be the slave of all. For the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many."
