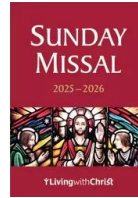

WORK AND PRAYER

One of the important pillars of stewardship is hospitality. The person who is hospitable can welcome anyone into their home, serve them, and make them feel loved. By serving strangers and friends alike, they serve God who is present in every person. This gift of hospitality is so important in the work of stewardship, as people will readily come back to a parish that welcomes them with open arms.

Today's Gospel tells us that Jesus visited the town of Bethany and stayed at the home of Martha and Mary. Here, we see an example of hospitality, especially in the figure of Martha, who busied herself by taking care of Jesus and his disciples. Yet unlike the first reading, where Abraham is rewarded for his hospitality, Jesus tells Martha that her sister Mary had chosen the better part by being at his feet and listening to him.

When we live a life centered around stewardship, we can be like Martha, making ourselves overly busy with various ministries. It is easy to get caught up in our work and lose sight of what is truly important, namely, our relationship with Jesus. Our work is important, but equally important is our prayer, both of which are necessary if we wish to be good disciples and stewards [of the Lord]. When our prayer precedes our work, our work then truly becomes an extension of our prayer, and everything we do becomes rooted in Christ. If prayer is not part of our work of stewardship, let us make a greater effort to start off everything we do in prayer, allowing it to transform the work we do and to render our work more fruitful.
