

THE GOOD AND FAITHFUL STEWARD

In the Gospel parable, Jesus speaks of a faithful and prudent steward, who is aware of the duties given to him by the master and does them faithfully. On the other hand, Jesus speaks of an unfaithful servant, who abuses the gifts that the master has left him. He keeps the property for himself and mistreats the people around him. When the master returns at a time that neither servant expects, he deals with each according to their deeds. To the faithful steward, the master blesses him even more, but the servant who abused the gifts given to him was punished.

Jesus says to the disciples, "You also must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come." There will come a time of judgment when we will be asked to account for how we used what was given to us by God. When Jesus comes again, he will look to see what we value as our treasure, since he says, "Where your treasure is, there also will your heart be."

What are we doing with the gifts that the master has entrusted to us? Are we watchful and faithful stewards, or are we like the unfaithful servant who would rather use the gifts selfishly? The Lord has given us many gifts, and these gifts are not meant solely for our own consumption. They are given to us to build up the community of God and uplift those around us. Let us spend some time this week examining our hearts, seeing how we are using the gifts God has given us. If we feel God calling us to give of ourselves in a more profound way, let us take the opportunity to visit our parish priest to see the ways in which we can continue to be good and faithful stewards.
